A Message to Our Community

The Saskatoon Preschool Foundation continued in 2014 to uphold our mission of advocating for and supporting access to preschool programs. We did this by providing 92 tuition subsidies in the amount of \$59,415.00 to 35 different preschools in the City of Saskatoon and surrounding area.

As Saskatoon grows, the number of tuition subsidy applications from families requesting financial support increases as well. Preschool education costs are also increasing annually, thus requiring increases to our subsidies in order to keep preschool costs affordable for financially strapped families. We strive to meet the needs of the community so as not to deny the significant, positive impact that preschool provides to a developing child.

We again provided opportunities for preschool teachers to attend our sponsored workshops on Positive Behaviour Interventions and Supports free of charge.

Our Board is fully committed to our mission and has seen the addition of several new members.

We cannot thank enough our corporate and individual donors, for without your continuing support, we would not be able to fulfil our mission.

Advocacy/Public Relations Committee

There are three main goals regarding Advocacy/Public Relations with a variety of related activities that took place in 2014. Some activities are related to more than one goal and the work of other committees. The goals and some of the activities of the SPF include the following.

- To raise the level of awareness of the people of Saskatoon and area regarding the SPF and its work through, among others:
- the annual raffle, including a ticket and information booth in a local business, and
- workshops related to Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) for individuals who work with preschool-age children.
- To ensure that all children have access to preschool through, among others:
- · support for fundraising activities,
- approval of tuition subsidies for preschoolers whose families would have difficulty providing the resources,
- exploration of the gap that currently exists for preschoolers with some degree of special need that places them in the zone above the 2% of children who qualify for school division supports (e.g., a preschooler with an intellectual disability in the mild range who may not be toilet trained) and
- meeting with representatives of the Early Learning and Childcare Department of the Saskatchewan Ministry of Education.
- To continue to improve public relations and communication through, among others:
- · website updates,
- presentations and distribution of information about the Foundation at workshops and conferences (e.g., the Preschool Information Registry System, the Early Childhood Education Conference),
- communication with the Ministry of Education regarding the work of the SPF and its fit with the goals of the ministry,
- invitations to interested individuals to attend our Annual Meeting and

 recruitment of new board members representing a wide variety of preschool populations.

Positive Behaviour Interventions and Supports Workshops

The SPF continued to sponsor full-day workshops on Positive Behaviour Supports (PBS) for preschool and prekindergarten teachers, teacher assistants and preschool board members, beginning in April 2013. These workshops provided information regarding practical steps toward a positive environment for successful student learning and social behavior. In 2014, two different workshops provided information at the introductory level and at a more intensive level for students who need something more than what is provided to all the students. Participants have had the opportunity to learn about the fundamental elements of PBIS as well as strategies to increase the positive behavior of their students. Feedback from the workshops indicated that the participants felt the information would be highly valuable in assisting them in their work with children. Providing the workshops at no cost to the participants makes attendance more accessible due to the financial restraints related to professional development for many individuals who work with preschoolers. In response, the SPF has planned two additional workshops in 2015.
